The historic corner – Biographical Information of the Patriarch Ignacio Francisco Mori Romani (1828-1894)*

- 1) When and where was the Patriarch Mori born? He was born in the year 1828 in the village of San Gavino in Bastia, Corsica. His father was named Francisco Mori and his mother Dominica (Dominga) Romani. There are no known siblings, but it is assumed that he had siblings in Corsica.
- 2) When and why did he travel to the Americas? He embarked around 1846 from the port of Bastia, former capital of Corsica, a French Province, soon after his eighteenth birthday. In those times, as today, the youth emigrate in search of better economic opportunities they lack in their native land. Others did it for legal or political reasons. In the case of the Patriarch Mori, his granddaughter Justa Mori used to say: "grandpa arrived as a runaway to avoid going to war. He left Corsica when France was at war with Europe." She might have been referring to the Second French Revolution which ended in 1848. This granddaughter of the Patriarch, who lived over a hundred years, narrated other stories of our family history, and her cousins confirmed that, "Ignacio Mori came looking for someone called Pietri that was also born in Bastia." Pietri had a coffee plantation on a mountain in Yauco. "Grandpa Ignacio didn't know where this Pietri plantation was located", his great granddaughter Rate Mori used to say.
- 3) What happened in his travel to the Americas? He disembarked in the island of Martinique because of an accident—Rate Mori narrated that "there was awful weather during the trip and the ship where grandpa Ignacio was travelling in was damaged. They were forced to stop in Martinica to repair the ship. That is why Ignacio Mori lived there for a while." The year is unknown, but it must have been between 1846 and no later than 1854. "In Martinique, Ignacio met a widowed lady that owned a hotel. They lived together as a couple there", stated his great granddaughter. Years later it was known that her name was Petrona. When "they sold the hotel and came to live in Puerto Rico," his granddaughter Sarito Mori used to say, Petrona brought the daughter from her former marriage with her.
